PRESIDENT’S REPORT

- Recognized the ACC Baseball Team for winning the Region XIV Tournament and the first trip to JUCO World Series.
- Graduations:
 - 474 students applied for graduation at ACC this summer.
 - 23 cadets graduated from the Law Enforcement Academy Day Class 78 on May 14.
 - 20 cadets graduated from the Law Enforcement Academy Night Class 77 on May 15.
 - 28 men graduated from the TDCJ program on May 19.
 - 72 nurses graduated from the ADN Program this year.
 - 29 students graduated from the LVN Program this year.
- The Texas Board of Nursing has sent commendation to all faculty and administration for the graduates’ 98.04%

pass rate on the NCLEX-RN ® for the 2007 examination year.

- At this time 180 qualified applicants have applied for the Associate Degree Nursing program. Of those applicants 38 have Bachelors Degrees.
- The ACC Foundation presented 36 scholarships to AHS graduates, totaling \$25,900, at Senior Awards Night on May 5. The first Mamie Louise Payte Scholarship of \$5,000 was awarded to Amanda Schuenemann.
- Alvin High School dual credit students Brandi Hartman and Stephanie Vargas, who are enrolled in the Emergency Medical Technology Basic program at ACC, placed first at the state Health Occupations Students of America (HOSA) competition in Austin recently. Hartman and Vargas won over 20 other schools in the EMT category and will compete at the national level in June.
- Career Services and the Continuing Education and Workforce Development Department are partnering to host 2008 Job Expo on May 22 in Pearland. The event will bring together approximately 40 employers, from industries like banking, manufacturing, retail, sales, and more, who are looking to fill many positions. In addition to bringing employers and job seekers together, a resume center will be available during the event.
- To give high school students an opportunity to earn community service experience for honor societies, student council, and scholarship applications, ACC's College's radio station, KACC 89.7 FM, will offer its annual summer

program beginning on June 10. Designed for high school students who are college-bound, the KACC summer program serves as a registered Community Service Provider for students desiring to help their community through broadcasting on-air public service announcements, participating in public service campaigns and mentoring elementary students.

- ACC Student Activities will host a blood drive at the main campus on June 10-11 from 9 a.m. until 3 p.m.
- ACC will host a Process Technology Open House on June 17, from 5 to 8 p.m., at the Nolan Ryan Center. The event is sponsored by the National Science Foundation through a grant provided by the Center for the Advancement of Process Technology and the Gulf Coast Process Technology Alliance, American Chemical Society, Shell Oil, BP, Lyondell Chemical, Solutia, INEOS and Champion Technologies. Representatives from these organizations and companies will be present to discuss the various aspects and benefits of working in this field.
- The Most Valuable Players for the baseball, softball and volleyball programs at ACC were named during the annual Sports Banquet on April 25. Chris Herrmann, of Tomball, was named the baseball MVP for the 2007-2008 season. Kristi Kelly, of DeBerry, was named the softball MVP and Samantha Wilson, of Spring, was named the volleyball MVP.
- ACC Computer Science students Ben Alred, Alex Goodman and John Hayslip won first place Best Team in the

advanced division at the University of Houston-Clear Lake Programming Challenge 2008 on April 19. Each student received a \$500 scholarship and various door prizes.

- ACC Foundation Vice President Cheryl Knape presented the annual Excellence Awards to a faculty, TSCM (Technical Support, Clerical, and Maintenance) and administrative employee during the annual President's Tea on April 29. The recipients were biology instructor Dwight Rhodes, accounts payable specialist Carole Hallows and dean of instruction Dr. John Bethscheider. The three award winners were nominated by college faculty and staff and selected by a committee. Each recipient received a plaque and \$1,000. The goal of these awards is to recognize individual staff members who have not only achieved excellence in performance of their job over a sustained period of time, but have also provided exemplary service to the college and community. The ACC Foundation hosts events each year to raise money for student scholarships, enrichment programs and these awards.
- Charity Wilcox, a 4.0 GPA paralegal student at ACC, won two first place awards at the 2008 Career Enhancement Symposium, sponsored by the Houston Metropolitan Paralegal Association, at the South Texas School of Law in Houston on April 19. The awards, which were for interviewing and resume writing, earned Charity \$500 worth of scholarships.
