# DUAL ENROLLMENT PROGRAM

## Participating in the Alvin Community College Dual Enrollment program has many benefits:

- Earn an Associate's and/or Bachelor's Degree in less time
- Save money with discounted tuition
- Complete college core classes while earning high school credits
- Earn technical certifications to prepare for the workforce (AISD schools only)

### Where are Dual Enrollment courses offered and who teaches them?

Dual Enrollment classes are college classes taught at the high schools, at the main ACC campus or online. They are taught by college professors or credentialed high school instructors.

### What are Academic Transfer or Technical Pathways?

Academic Transfer Pathways prepare students to transfer to four-year universities. Students can complete relevant coursework for their intended major or earn an Associate's Degree in General Studies while in high school. Technical Certificate Pathways prepare students to enter the workforce after high school graduation through successful completion of certification exams.

### Are Dual Enrollment credits the same as AP credits?

Unlike AP courses, which require students to pass an end-of-year exam, Dual Enrollment students receive college credits, which will transfer to all Texas public colleges and universities after completing the course (students must earn a C or higher). Students are encouraged to meet with their ACC Dual Enrollment Advisor to determine which Dual Enrollment classes best fit their college and career plans.

### How do I get started with Dual Enrollment?
