- 1. More than 200,000 students have taken courses at ACC in its history.
- 2. The first Dual Degree graduate was Thomas Schuenemann in 2008.
- 3. ACC opened the Child Development Lab School in 1978.
- 4. AJC Volleyball Team won the national NJCAA championship in 1974.
- 5. KACC is a 5.600-watt FM radio station.
- 6. KACC went on the air in 1978.
- 7. The ACC district includes 421.8 square miles.
- 8. ACC was administered by Alvin ISD from 1948 to 1972.
- 9. The main campus has 16 buildings on 114 acres.
- 10. ACC moved from Alvin High School to the main campus in 1963.
- 11. ACC was named a Hispanic Serving Institution in 2016.
- 12. The Science/Health Science building was opened in 2008.
- 13. ACC Foundation was established in 1974.
- 14. ACC was the first Texas community college to open a Law Enforcement Academy in 1970.
- 15. ACC was the first Texas community college to offer courses to TDCJ inmates in 1965.
- 16. ACC was first ranked among the top community colleges in the nation by the Aspen Institute in 2010.
- 17. ACC was first accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools in 1959.
- 18. The Nolan Ryan Center opened in 1996.
- 19. Buildings A, B, C and D opened in 1978, effectively doubling the size of the campus.
- 20. Alvin Junior College was renamed Alvin Community College in 1975.
- 21. Building N was constructed in 1982.
- 22. Building H was constructed in 1966.
- 23. The courtyard memorial was built in honor of the 50th anniversary.
- 24. The Community Chorus first performed in 2014.
- 25. The Community Band first performed in 1994.

- 26. ACC once had the Guinness World Record for longest paper chain, 51.8 miles, built in one day in 1998.
- 27. ACC classes were first held in the Fall of 1949 at Alvin High School.
- 28. The Science/Health Science Building is 98,790 square feet.
- 29. Hurricane Ike caused \$15 million in damages to the campus in 2008.
- 30. The softball field was named for Ruth Ryan in 2005.
- 31. Buildings A, B, C and D together total 200,000 square feet.
- 32. More than 4,000 cadets have graduated from the Law Enforcement Academy.
- 33. ACC was among the first in the country to have an accredited sleep study program.
- 34. ACC had the first accredited pediatric echocardiography program in the country.
- 35. The Upward Bound program at ACC began in 2003.
- 36. ACC has had seven presidents in its history.
- 37. The ACC Board of Regents was created in 1972.
- 38. Voters approved a \$19.9 million bond in 2005 to build the Science/ Health Science Building.
- 39. More than 4,000 ACC students have been inducted into the Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society.
- 40. The ACC Nursing program began in 1965.

- 42. The Drafting program was among the college's first programs.

- 45. Alvin Junior College was created by a vote of 743-31 in 1948.

- 48. ACC offers Dual Enrollment courses at 9 local high schools.
- 49. The Maintenance Facility opened in 1980.
- 50. ACC has a two-mile jogging trail around the campus.

- 52. The first class of students at Alvin Junior College was called the "13th and 14th grades."
