Lora-Marie Bernard, an author of several Texas nonfiction history books, has been called one of the state's best storytellers by Texas A&M's Texana Reads and received the Dan Parkinson Literary Award and the Catherine Munson Foster Memorial Award for Literature. A graduate of the Mayborn School of Journalism at the University of North Texas, she also earned a master's degree at Harvard University and currently serves as a board member for Harvard's largest women's alumni group. She was a nationally award-winning Texas-based investigative journalist for many years and earned the Robert F. Kennedy Journalism Award. Ms. Bernard left journalism after serving as a Washington D.C. field correspondent, an international radio commentator, and a multimedia reporter. Her coverage included the 2017 Trump presidential campaign. She currently works as the City of Lake Jackson's first public information officer, and her efforts to build the new program have earned the city several top state awards.
