Important things you need to know about Dual Enrollment

- This is a college course. The grade students make in the course will be on a college transcript
- Course fees are paid before each semester begins. Once in fall and once in spring.
- Students must purchase textbooks if required for the course.
- Daily grades are not posted in Skyward. Most grades will be in the college system, Blackboard.

Do courses transfer?

Yes, Dual Enrollment courses that are part of the Texas General Ed Core Curriculum will transfer to any Texas state or public institution and often times do transfer to private and out of state schools.
