The Faculty and staff of the Alvin Community College Emergency Medical Technology Program are excited about your interest in becoming an Emergency Medical Services professional!

All students who enter the Emergency Medical Technology Program are required to navigate a streamlined application process. Applicants are carefully screened and then scored using the appropriate application scoring rubric for the level of application; EMT-Basic; Advanced EMT; or Paramedic. A copy of each rubric is included in this packet. Alvin Community College nor the Emergency Medical Technology Program discriminate against any persons on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin, veteran status, age, sex, familial status, marital status, ancestry, and/or sexual or affectionate orientation.

The Emergency Medical Services profession is both mentally and physically challenging. The Emergency Medical Technology Program courses are also both mentally and physically challenging. Because of the unique environment in which Emergency Medical Services (EMS) personnel function, it is important for you to have a firm understanding of the demands of the profession. A copy of the Functional Job Description for an EMS profession as described by the Texas Health and Safety Code is included in this packet. You should read it carefully before beginning the application process. You need to assess your ability to perform the required functions of an EMS professional. If you cannot perform the tasks described in the Functional Job Description for an EMS profession as described by the Texas Health and Safety Code, you are putting yourself and others at risk of injury or worse. Please carefully consider this when deciding to apply.

If you feel you are able to perform the functions of an EMS professional as described by the Functional Job Description but need learning accommodations during the application process or during your enrollment in the Emergency Medical Technology Program courses, please contact the Office of Student Accessibility Services. The Emergency Medical Technology Program can guarantee each student will be afforded equal opportunity during the application process and during the instructional phase. Please keep in mind that it is your responsibility to take advantage of any accessibility services for which you qualify by contacting the Office of Student Accessibility Services. Applicants should also be aware that specific criteria must be met to earn and obtain a course completion that will allow them to take the certification exam.

This packet also includes a list of the Emergency Medical Technology Program's prerequisites and application instructions.



### **Emergency Medical Technician – Basic Applicant Qualifications**

Completed the Apply Texas process and been accepted as an Alvin Community College student

Be at least 17 years old and will be 18 years old on or before the course end date

Meet one of the following criteria:

- A high school senior participating in a dual enrollment EMT course OR
- Have a valid high school diploma OR
- Have a valid GED
- o Have a valid home-school certificate of completion or diploma
  - High school diplomas must be from a school accredited by the Texas Education Agency (TEA) or a corresponding agency from another state. Applicants who received a high school education in another country must have their transcript evaluated by a foreign credentials evaluation service that attests to its equivalency. A home school diploma is acceptable. (TAC Rule §157.33 Certification)

### Have one of the following:

- A valid non-expired Texas Driver's License OR
- A valid non-expired Texas Identification card OR
- o A valid non-expired United States passport

Have a valid Social Security Card or Permanent Resident Card

DO NOT currently hold an EMT certification in the state of Texas or in any other state; active or inactive

Have NOT successfully completed an EMT course at ACC or any other EMS education program within the last 2 years

Can provide detailed valid immunization documentation

Agree to submit to a background check


Agree to submit to drug screening and receive a negative result


Meet the functional and physical qualifications required to work as an EMS professional

Complete, in its entirety, the Emergency Medical Technician-Basic application by the posted deadline











### **Emergency Medical Technician – Basic Functional Job Description**

The following general position description should guide you when considering what qualifications competencies, and tasks are required of an EMS professional. Please keep all of the requirements listed below in mind when deciding to apply to the ACC Emergency Medical Technology Program and in becoming an EMS professional.

### • Qualifications Required to Work as an EMS Professional

- Successfully complete an approved EMS education course (EMT, Advanced, EMT, or Paramedic) offered by an approved Texas Department of State Health Services.
- Successfully pass the EMT, Advanced EMT, or Paramedic certification exam administered by the National Registry of EMT's.
- You must be 18 years of age to *work* as an EMS professional. (Students may take the course at the age of 17 but cannot begin working until they turn 18)
- You must have a high school diploma or equivalent (GED)
- You must be able to communicate using written documentation, verbally face-to-face, by telephone, by computer, and by radio
- O You must be able to lift, carry, and balance up to 125 pounds; 250 with assistance
- You must be able to interpret written and oral instructions
- You must be able to use good judgment and remain calm in high-stress and chaotic situations
- You must be able to work effectively in an environment with loud noises, flashing lights, and many other distractions
- You must be able to function effectively with little to no sleep throughout an entire work shift which can be 24 hours or more
- o You must be able to read small print under life-threatening time constraints
- You must be able to speak, read, and understand manuals and road maps published in the English language
- o You must be able to read information on a computer screen, discern street signs, and address numbers
- You must be able to confidently and professionally interview patients, family members, bystanders, and other first responders such as law enforcement and fire personnel
- You must be able to document patient care contacts in a prescribed format that can be defendable in a court of law
- You must possess moderate computer skills
- You must be able to converse confidently and professionally in English with coworkers and hospital staff as to the status of patients
- You must possess good manual dexterity with the ability to perform all tasks related to highest quality patient care
- o You must be able to bend, stoop, and crawl on uneven terrain
- You must be able to withstand varied environmental conditions such as extreme heat, cold, and moisture while maintaining exemplary patient care
- o You must be able to work in low light, confined spaces, and other dangerous environments











### Emergency Medical Technician - Basic Functional Job Description

The following general position description should guide you when considering what qualifications competencies, and tasks are required of an EMS professional. Please keep all of the requirements listed below in mind when deciding to apply to the ACC Emergency Medical Technology Program and in becoming an EMS professional.

### Emergency Medical Technician Professional Competency Areas

- You must demonstrate competence in handling emergencies using basic life support equipment and skills in accordance with all cognitive, psychomotor, and behavioral objectives in the EMT National Standard Curriculum. The skills include:
  - Effective communication skills
  - Effective writing skills for patient care documentation (legal documents)
  - Exemplary ethical and moral character with the ability to take accountability and responsibility for mistakes
  - Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation
  - Bandaging and Splinting
  - Traction Splinting
  - Mechanical Aids for Breathing
  - Vital Signs
  - Patient Assessment
  - Spinal Motion Restriction
  - Automated External Defibrillation
  - Small-Volume Nebulizer
  - Metered-Dose Inhalers
  - Epinephrine Auto-Injectors
  - Pneumatic Anti-Shock Garments
  - Administration of some emergency medications
    - Activated Charcoal
    - Aspirin
    - Bronchodilators
    - Epinephrine
    - Oral Glucose
    - Oxygen
    - Nitroglycerin

#### Criminal Background Check Requirement Information

All Program affiliates require that each student enrolled in the Program who will be coming to their facilities/agencies for clinical experiences must have a clear background. Background screening helps to promote and protect patient safety. Acceptance into the Program is strictly prohibited for any applicant who has been convicted of, attempted to, conspired to, or solicited any of the following:

- Capital Murder
- Murder
- Manslaughter
- Criminally negligent homicide
- Unlawful restraint
- Kidnapping
- Aggravated kidnapping
- Continuous sexual abuse of a young child or children
- Indecent exposure
- · Indecency with a child
- Improper relationship between an educator and student
- Sexual assault
- Aggravated assault
- Aggravated Sexual assault
- Assault
- Intentional, knowing, or reckless injury to a child, elderly individual, or disabled individual
- · Intentional, knowing, or reckless abandonment or endangerment of a child
- Deadly conduct
- Terroristic threat

- Aiding in suicide
- · Prohibited sexual conduct (incest)
- Agreement to abduct a child from custody
- Violation of certain orders in family violence cases
- Violation of protective orders in family violence cases
- Violation of protective order preventing hate crime
- Sale or purchase of a human
- Arson
- Robbery
- Aggravated robbery
- Burglary
- Online solicitation of a minor
- Money laundering
- Medicare/Medicaid fraud
- Insurance fraud
- Cruelty to animal(s)
- Causing sexual performance by a child
- Possession or promotion or production of child pornography
- Any other offense for which registration as a sex offender is required

Students must not have convictions in the 5 calendar years from any state or jurisdiction for any of the following:

- Assault punishable as a Class A misdemeanor or felony
- Theft punishable as a felony
- Misapplication of fiduciary property of financial institution punishable as a Class A misdemeanor
- Securing execution of a document by deception punishable as a Class A misdemeanor or felony (not tampering with a government record)
- False identification as/to a law enforcement officer
- Disorderly conduct
- Driving under the influence
- Driving while intoxicated

Should any of the above be discovered on an applicant's background screen, the applicant is automatically ineligible for acceptance into the Program.

If an applicant believes his/her background information is incorrect, the *applicant* is responsible for working with the screening company to attempt to correct the issue. Until the screening company issues a clear background report, the applicant is ineligible for admittance into the Program. If the applicant is not able to obtain a clear background report from the screening company, the applicant must receive background clearance from the Texas Department of State Health Services. (*See next section*)

### Texas Department of State Health Services Criminal Background Review/Clearance Information


The nature of the EMS profession requires restrictions to be placed on credentialing of persons with criminal histories. The ACC EMT Program is *not* able to advise a student with a criminal history if he/she will be eligible for certification by the state of Texas upon completion of the course and passing the NREMT certification exam.

Applicants who need a criminal background review for background clearance must contact the Texas Department of State Health Services: Call 512.834.6700, then Option 5

Applicants who receive a background clearance letter from the Texas Department State Health Services *must* upload the letter into the Criminal Background Clearance section of the ACC EMT Program application.

#### **Drug Screening Requirement Information**

All Program affiliates require that all students who visit their facilities/agencies to have submitted to at least one drug screen and have documentation of a negative result within the same semester the student will be coming to their facility/agency. Random drug tests will occur each semester. The cost of random drug screens is encumbered by the student.

Applicants who test positive for one or more of the following substances (without proof of a valid prescription) are automatically ineligible for admittance into the Program:

- Amphetamines
- Barbiturates
- Benzodiazepines
- Cocaine Metabolites
- Marijuana (tetrahydrocannabinol)
- Methadone
- Methaqualone
- Opiates
- Oxycodone
- Phencyclidine
- Propoxyphene

Applicants who test positive for any of the above-listed substances (without a valid prescription) during a random drug screen must withdraw from the Program and is ineligible to reapply for 12 months.

#### **ACC Student Email**

It is the policy of ACC that college-hosted email is the official means of communication. It is imperative that students accepted into the Program have access to and check their ACC student email daily.

#### **ACC EMT Program Vaccination Requirements**

All Program affiliates require that all students who visit their facilities/agencies are sufficiently vaccinated against several communicable diseases that are commonly found in healthcare settings. Applicants must provide documented proof of the following vaccinations/negative test results:

- Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR)
- Varicella (Chicken Pox)
- Hepatitis B
- Tuberculosis
- Tetanus
- Meningitis
- Influenza
- COVID required at 95% of the Program's current clinical affiliates; Program students who are **not** vaccinated are only allowed to complete his/her hospital and EMS rotations at the affiliates who do not require it. These spots are limited. Students are required to complete their rotations by the course end date.

### Vaccination declinations are not allowed.

### **AHA Healthcare Provider CPR Certification**

All Program affiliates require that all students who visit their facilities/agencies to have a current American Heart Association BLS Provider CPR certification. The Program offers a CPR course to its students once a semester. The cost of the course is \$50.00.











### **Uniform Requirement**

Students accepted into the Program are required to purchase a uniform and wear it to every class session and during clinical rotations. Vendor information for purchasing uniform components will be included in applicant acceptance letters.

The required uniform components are as follows:

- Blue Polo Shirt
- Black trauma (cargo) pants
- Solid black belt
- Black first responder boots
- Stethoscope
- Penlight
- Trauma Shears

#### **Tuition and Fees**

Tuition is based upon a student's residency status that is on file with the ACC Registrar's Office. ACC may change tuition rates and other fees without notice or when so directed by the Board of Regents. 
