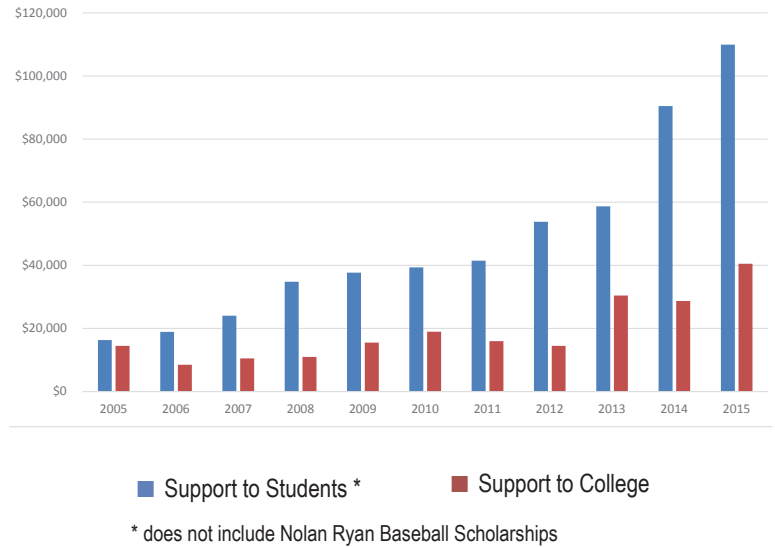

## How the ACC Foundation Distributes, Utilizes Funds

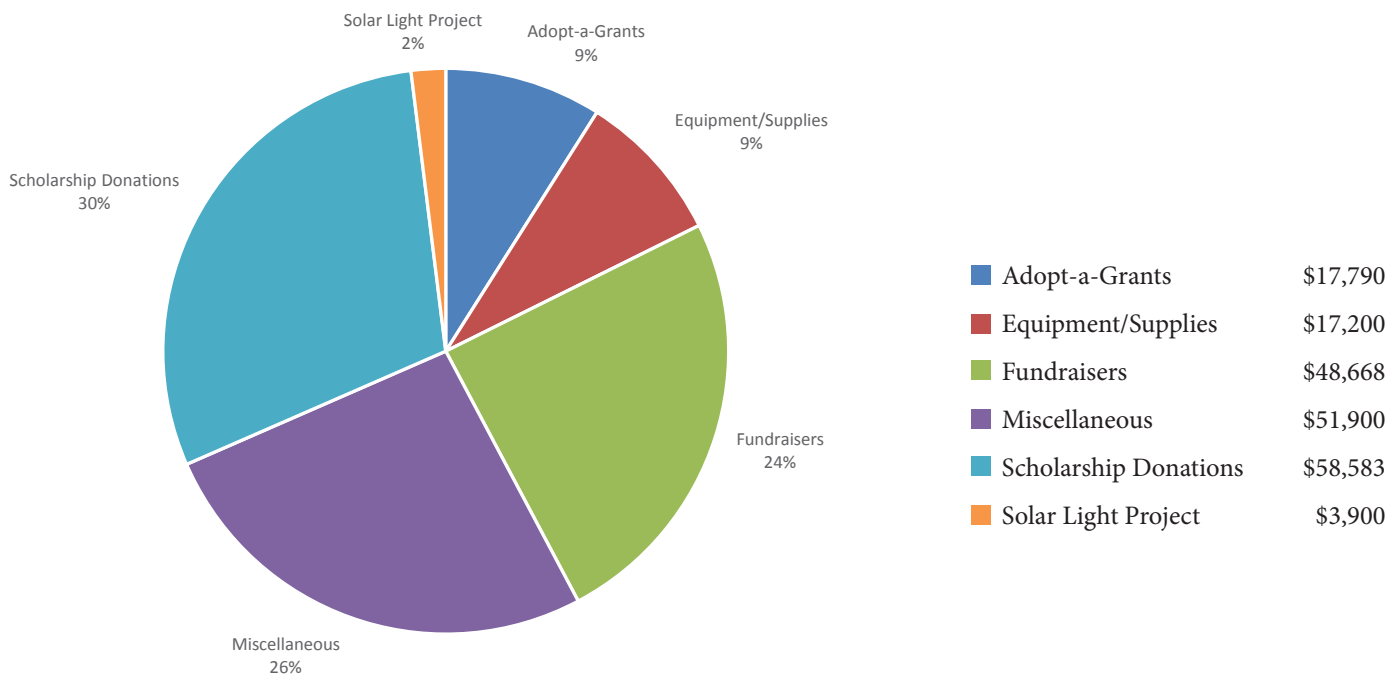
Funds received from private donations are distributed in the manner requested by the donor, if specified. If not specified, the donation is allocated toward opportunity scholarships. Funds raised during the annual events are divided in half – with 50 percent being used toward scholarships and 50 percent toward faculty and staff development programs and community enrichment projects.

Another goal of any foundation is to increase its fund balance, so it can be invested in a manner that will foster a cycle of continued financial gain throughout the history of the college. As the balance grows, so does the interest it accrues, which means more scholarships can be made available to students each year. ACC Foundation funds are maintained by RBC Wealth Management, one of the nation's largest full-service securities firm.

# AWARDS & GRANTS

## Excellence Awards

The Foundation honors dedicated faculty and staff members who work tirelessly to make the college a quality educational institution. The Foundation annually recognizes a Technical, Support Clerical and Maintenance employee, an administrative staff employee and a faculty member who fulfill ACC's mission. Each recipient receives a plaque and \$1,000.

Winners this year are ACC Fiscal Affairs Director Deborah Kraft, Math Department chair Jennifer Hopkins, and Testing coordinator Angela Fox.

## Solar Light Project



The Foundation continued its support of the Solar Light Project for the 2-mile jogging trail on campus. Nearly \$4,000 was donated by the Foundation for the project to pay for additional lights and installation. In 2014, the Foundation awarded \$50,500 in grants and donations to install the solar-powered light. To date, 12 solar-powered light fixtures have been set up along a portion of the 2-mile jogging trail on campus. The 100-Watt lights will increase safety for walkers and runners.

The project has also been supported by a grant from Texas New Mexico Power, faculty member Nancey Lobb and donations from the Adopt A Grant program.



## Innovative Initiative Grants

The Innovative Initiative Grants were established in 2012 to fund projects and programs created by faculty and staff to boost student success and create a positive campus environment. The college awarded eight such grants in 2015 for a total of \$9,400:



**Real World Career Planning Program** that funded free access to career testing including the Strong Interest Inventory and the Myers-Briggs Type Indicator. Taking the tests will help students create a clearly defined career path.

**Dual Credit Student Ambassadors program** to provide support for 10 students who will promote and recruit for the dual credit program at five area high schools which are seeing rapid student growth.

**Dolphin Camp Two-Day Freshman Welcome program** which gives new students with an opportunity to establish relationships with new peers through a series of challenges and activities.

**Love Ya Blue** funds a scholarship for a student to serve as the ACC mascot, Blue. The dedicated student will help Blue meet his appearance demands in the community and on campus.

**ACC Elections and Policy Center** to fund publishing of a non-partisan voting guide for Brazoria County elections.

**Visiting Artists at ACC Art Studios program**, which funds workshops from visiting painters, sculptors and illustrators to the campus to teach their unique styles.

**Emergency Loan grant** to provide funding to students facing financial challenges.

**Marketing and Recruiting for the Drama program** to help increase enrollment while also developing positive relationships with area educational drama programs. The Foundation's support will also generate audience participation with ACC's drama productions.

**English Department Professional Development program** will be used to fund guest speakers for department meetings. The program will help faculty members share ideas and developments to improve their instruction and student achievement.

## Market Commentary

Period Ending December 31, 2015

The up and down, track and forth movement of the equity market persisted in the fourth quarter. The S&P 500 rallied 7.0% including dividends following a 6.4 % decline in the third quarter as fears about the Chinese economy diminished and investors became more confident that the Federal Reserve's rate hike cycle will likely be gradual. The rally was enough to push the full year performance into positive territory. The S&P 500 rose 1.4% and Dow Jones Industrial Average inched up 0.2% in 2015 on a total return basis. However, those were hard-fought gains and many stocks didn't participate. The top three performing stocks accounted for all of the gains in the S&P 500. At year end,

61% of S&P 500 stocks had fallen 10% or more from their 52-week highs. Sector activity was also mixed with only five of the 10 S&P 500 sectors rising for the year. Consumer stocks led the market as positive employment trends and lower gasoline prices helped the consumer sector grow at a faster rate than the overall economy. Consumer Discretionary rallied 10% for the year while Consumer Staples rose 6.6%. Health Care also performed well, climbing almost 7%. Energy lagged the most, falling 21 % due to the severe crude oil correction. The Federal Reserve's decision in December to raise its benchmark Federal Funds rate 25 basis points was the big story. Beginning with the October FOMC meeting, the Fed began to signal its intention to raise rates and short-term Treasury rates moved higher in anticipation; as a result the hike

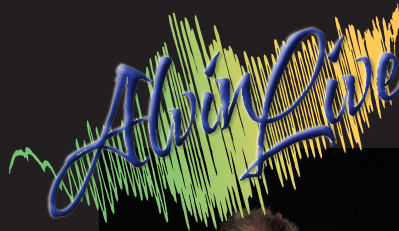
itself was somewhat anticlimactic. Looking ahead the focus will be on what comes next from the Fed and there is a disagreement between Fed forecasts which call for four rate hikes in 2016 and market expectations of two. Fed guidance continues to be that the next tightening cycle will adopt a gradual, not mechanical approach with policy decisions driven by the data; we contend this data dependent focus includes both U.S. and global economic conditions. The yield on the 10 Yr T-note ended 2015 at 2.27% • well below early-year forecasts. but it was a volatile year with Fed uncertainty, international development, and weak energy prices being the main drivers.

# EVENTS

## Christmas Gala

The 16th Annual Christmas Gala, *An Evening of Elegance*, was the Foundation's most successful gala to date. The event included a steak dinner, performances by the Big Swing Jazz Orchestra and the Big Swing Jazz Trio, silent and live auctions. Thanks to the support of all our guests, nearly \$52,000 was raised.



The Foundation hosted three entertaining musical performances for the annual Alvin Live Summer Concert Series. Taking the stage in the 2015 series were Country legend Radney Foster, LC Roots and The Pee Wee Bowen Band. Generous donations from Alvin Rotary and the Foundation helped fund the studio's construction. The 2015 Concert Series raised funds to purchase equipment that is used to help stream KACC 89.7 FM audio for a new app. The station launched the new app for Apple iOS and Android phones to offer live broadcasts of the station including classic rock music, live events and local sports. ACC Live series uses the studio setting for its productions on 89.7 FM and KACC-TV, Cable Access Channel 16. The intimate venue seats 65 guests. Funds raised from Alvin Live performances are used for ACC Broadcast Communications student training and scholarships.

## Memorial Wall

The Foundation provided funds to make updates to the ACC Memorial Wall to include those service members who lost their lives in the Global War on Terror. The new names were added to the wall and were unveiled at a Veterans Day Ceremony. Several Gold Star families were at the event to honor their loved ones as their names were called out during the ceremony.

Those added to the wall are: Army 1st Lt. Timothy W. Cunningham, Alvin, TX; Army Specialist Joshua Lee Hazlewood, of Manvel; Marine Lance Corporal Christopher M. McCrackin, of Alvin; Lance Corporal Ryan A. Miller, of Pearland; Marine Lance Corporal William L. Miller, of Pearland; Army Sgt. James M. Nolen, of Alvin and Army Specialist Brett L. Tribble, of Danbury.

The Memorial Wall was built in 1989 and contains the names of those soldiers from the ACC region who have died in World War I, World War II, the Korean War, the Vietnam War and now the War on Terror. The additions were made after a request from the Veterans Club and the ACC Foundation provided the funds for the new plaques.



## ACC Highlights 2015

### Strategic Plan Approved

Regents approved the five year strategic plan during a meeting in November. The strategic plan will be implemented throughout 2016 to 2021. It includes six breakthrough goals: become an evidence-based, data-driven organization to improve efficiency and increase student achievement; develop a facility on the West Side of the ACC district and address faculty and technology needs for the existing campus; develop branding that is an effective representation of the college and its mission; develop programs and partnerships to meet job market demands; efficiently allocate revenues and strengthen human resources to create a staff that embraces change, supports open communication and provides for ongoing development.

### Foundation Receives TNMP Grant for Scholarships

The Foundation received a grant from the Texas New Mexico Power's inaugural Power Grant program in 2015. The \$5,000 grant will fund \$500 scholarships for 10 students with financial needs to complete workforce training and begin job interviews in their chosen industries. The Foundation was one of six organizations to receive a grant. The TNMP Fund in April introduced the grants to invest in its communities. The fund sought innovative and creative proposals that support the communities TNMP serves.

### Regents Approve 2015-16 Budget

Regents approved a \$28.15 million budget for the 2015-16 fiscal year which includes a 2-percent raise for faculty and staff and minor capital improvements. Regents also voted to keep the same tax rate from the previous year of 20.4 cents per \$100 of

property value. The rate includes 18.29 cents for Maintenance and Operations while 2.1 cents will go towards voter-approved debt.

### College Receives Grants to Upgrade Firing Range, Provide Job Training

ACC received two major grants to update facilities and provide training for local petrochemical employees in 2015. The college received \$1.4 million from the Texas Workforce Commission to provide training to more than 500 employees with the petrochemical firms Team Industrial Services and INEOS. The training includes courses in industrial safety, equipment repair/maintenance, plant processes and related technical applications of plant operations. The college also received a \$313,621 grant from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's Target Range Grant Program to upgrade its firing range to handle ammunition from rifles.



### Student Snapshot

- 83% plan to earn Associate's Degree or earn credits to transfer to a university.
- 64% of students are classified as freshmen and 6% already have at least one degree.
- The average age of an ACC student is 23. 27% are 17 years and younger, 46% are between 19 and 30 and 17% are over 30. The youngest student was 14 and the oldest was 85.
- Women make up 56% of the student population at ACC.
- Ethnicity: 47% White; 32% Hispanic; 12% Black; 5% Asian/Pacific Islander; 4% Other/Unknown.
- Although 97% of ACC students are from Texas, 52% come from out-of-district.
- ACC awarded 1,109 degrees and certificates in 2015.
