## UNDERSTANDING COLLEGE CLASSES FOR DUAL ENROLLMENT

An ACC college course that will count as Dual Enrollment at the high school must be approved by the ISD. Courses are discussed and approved annually by ACC and the ISD.

The approved list is available in the ISD Course Catalog and on the ACC Dual Enrollment webpage (under the counselor section).

Only core academic courses, foreign language, or technical courses applicable to a certificate, can be considered as Dual Enrollment courses.

# UNDERSTANDING COLLEGE CLASSES FOR DUAL ENROLLMENT

<u>Academic Dual Enrollment College Course</u> – core college courses that are part of ACC's transfer pathway degree. These courses transfer with a grade C or higher to Texas public colleges and universities, and most out of state public universities as well.

Examples: ENGL 1301 Composition I, GOVT 2305 Federal Government, PSYC 2301 General Psychology etc...

<u>Technical Dual Enrollment College Course</u> – courses that are part of workforce certificates and do not transfer to universities, but can transfer among community colleges.

Examples: CHEF 1205 Sanitation and Safety, WLDG 1521 Welding Fundamentals, AUMT 1405 Intro to Auto Tech etc...

# UNDERSIANDING DUAL ENROLLMENT PATHWAYS

### **ACC Academic Transfer Pathways**

- prepare students to transfer to 4 year universities.
- courses transfer with a grade C or higher to Texas public colleges and universities as core, directly for major or as elective (depends on students major).
- students have the opportunity to graduate with an Associate's in General Studies.

#### **ACC Certificate Pathways**

- prepare students to enter workforce after high school graduation upon successful completion of certification exams.
- courses do not transfer to universities but can transfer to other community colleges.
- students have the opportunity to apply courses to an Associate's degree if they
  continue with ACC after high school graduation.

## COLLEGE vs. FIEGH SCHOOL

- Fewer or no daily assignments.
- Lest frequent tests, which cover more material.
- Student responsibility to seek feedback from instructor.
- Instructors are experts in their field with a different approach in teaching methods.

- Assignments are often given daily.
- Frequent quizzes and tests.
- Continuous feedback.
- High school teachers are trained in teaching methods.

## ACC DUAL ENROLLMENT ACADEMIC STANDARDS

#### **AUTOMATIC WITHDRAWAL POLICY**

Students placed in an alternative school or facility due to disciplinary reasons exceeding one week, will be automatically withdrawn from all dual enrollment college courses and assigned a 'W' for each course. Students remaining enrolled during the one week placement are responsible for all assignments missed and will be held to any grading penalty incurred due to the attendance policy of the course(s). Students may appeal the automatic withdrawal by contacting both the ACC instructional Dean and Vice President of Student Services for review.

#### **HOMEBOUND POLICY**

Students entering a semester on homebound status should enroll in online classes only. Students enrolled in a college class on the high school campus who require homebound status during the semester may:

- i. withdraw from the college course if prior to the published withdrawal deadline.
- ii. receive permission from the faculty member to continue under his/her guidelines. Students are responsible for all assignments missed and will be subject to any grading penalty incurred due to the attendance policy of the course(s).
  - iii. receive an incomplete grade in the class if the faculty member deems it appropriate.

## ACC DUAL ENROLLMENT ACADEMIC STANDARDS

#### ACC 2.0 GPA

The college cumulative GPA will be calculated at the completion of each semester. Students whose college cumulative GPA is below 2.0, will be suspended from taking additional dual enrollment classes for one long semester (Fall or Spring); however a student may retake only the course they've earned a 'F' or 'D' in during the semester of suspension. Students can be reinstated the following semester. After completing classes during the reinstated semester, if the semester GPA remains below 2.0, future participation in the Dual Enrollment program will be prohibited.

#### **FOREIGN LANGUAGE**

A grade of C or higher is required to move to the next Foreign Language; and to guarantee transferability of core courses.

## ACC DUAL ENROLLMENT ACADEMIC STANDARDS

#### **COURSE GRADE APPEAL**

A student shall have one year from the date a grade is assigned to submit a grade **appeal.** A student shall not be permitted to submit a grade appeal because of general dissatisfaction with the grade, when a penalty has been assigned to the grade, or due to the outcome of a course as a result of a grade. In addition, disagreement with the instructor's professional judgment of the quality of the student's work and performance shall not be permitted as the basis for a grade appeal. During an appeal, the student is required to first meet with the faculty member for discussion and to seek resolution. If resolution does not occur at the faculty level, the student may first appeal to the Dean and then the VPI for further consideration. The VPI may schedule a conference with the student or refer the appeal to an Academic Appeals Committee. Since only grade appeals will be considered by the Academic Appeals Committee, this will be a designated committee and not an open institutional standing committee. # DID YOU KIND VOU


- College classes are taught by ACC Faculty/Master Degreed ISD Instructors
- College classes are offered on the high school campus, online, or on our main campus along with any satellite campus, for dual enrollment.
- Dual Enrollment college courses are not AP -
  - Advance Placement classes are high school classes with an end of year exam to determine college credit. Dual Enrollment classes are college classes that earn college credit throughout the semester.
  - AP classes usually have a higher GPA than Dual Enrollment classes.

 College courses are available to students in grades 9-12, for dual enrollment.

- Dual Enrollment students are exempt from the six drop rule and the threepeat rule while enrolled in the program.

## MHAT IS A SYLLABUS?

A **Syllabus** is an outline of information about the college course you are taking. For each class, students receive a **Syllabus** that includes:



- Course Name
- Instructor Name, Contact Information, and Office Hours
- Required Textbook Information
- Course Objectives
- Assignments & Due Dates (How to submit assignments)
- Attendance, Grading, & Late Work Policies
- Academic Dishonesty Statement
- Resources available for success!

- Most college daily grades are reported in Blackboard. Students should refer to this system to retrieve college grades, **NOT** the high school reporting system.
- Students are encouraged to keep track of their grades as assignments are returned. Not all assignments are graded; however, those that are should be monitored by the student.
- In college courses, it is not abnormal to only have
   4 graded assignments for the semester.
- STUDENTS, always, always, always communicate concerns regarding grades with your professor directly.

## CHAIN OF COMMAND

- Questions or concerns regarding curriculum, grades, or assignments, should be addressed by your student initially to:
  - The Instructor
  - The Department Chair
  - The Dean
- If a student is unsuccessful and parental involvement is warranted, a FERPA form must be on file before the professor will discuss directly with a parent.
- The ACC Advisor cannot assist with grades, assignments, curriculum, or any classroom specific concerns. These concerns must be addressed with the instructor and department chair directly.

## PARENT TIPS TO AID STUDENT SUCCESS

- Ensure that your student has thoroughly read through the course syllabus.
- Recognize that your parental role as related to their education shifts from primary advocate to secondary advocate when your student is enrolled in college courses.
- Encourage independence in solving problem.
   Allow your student the opportunity to solve any academic concerns. Resist the urge to handle an issue before your student has first attempted to resolve any problems.
- Help your student prepare for possible challenges that may arise throughout the school year.

- Assist in developing time management skills:
  - Break large assignments into meaningful pieces.
  - How to say "no" when sleep or studying is needed.
  - Find a good planner and/or calendar to track deadlines.
- Encourage your student to be engaged and aware in class.
- Understand that sometimes a straight A high school student may make their first C in a college level course.

## CLASS REGISTRATION PROCESS

- 1. The ACC Advisor registers each Dual Enrollment college student!!
  - This will take place in July for fall, or no later than the first week in August.
- 2. Students will receive emails once registered. The email will instruct students to log into the POD to review their registered courses.
  - Students will only see their fall courses. Spring registration will take place in November.



#### ACCess ID Setup

You must know your Student ID or Social Security Number to continue.

The setup process will:

- 1. Display your ACCess ID
- 2. Send a temporary password to an email address currently in the system.

You may then login to The POD to update your password.

#### Password requirements:

At least 8 characters long and contain at least 3 of the following categories:

- . English uppercase characters (A through Z)
- English lowercase characters (a through z)
- Numbers (0 through 9)
- Non-alphabetic characters (for example, !, \$, #, %)

Must not contain any part of your first or last name.





The Fall 2018 5 Payment Plan will be available from May 24, 2018 -June 18, 2018.



  - If students choose to purchase their textbooks outside of the ACC College store, please make sure that any codes and/or supplemental material needed is also purchased.






## **Book Buy Back**


